Workers Compensation Medical Services

The City of Charlotte's Risk Management Division is seeking proposals from qualified Companies to provide Workers Compensation Medical Services for Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools, Charlotte Regional Visitors Authority, and/or Mecklenburg EMS Agency (CRV) employees injured on the job. Combined, these five (5) organizations employ approximately 37,500 individuals. All workers compensation claims are processed through a third-party administrator. The Company is expected to work with the third-party administrator to ensure the claims are processed in a satisfactory and timely manner. The Company shall act as the representative for the Employer related to such services, including but not limited to the following:

Provide medical services pursuant to this contract for the Employing Agencies and their employees as a minimum of three (3) locations within Mecklenburg County with seven (7) day a week access to medical services at the Mecklenburg EMS Agency for treatment of on-the-job injuries. Every location must provide the same level of service to employees. The Company must have on staff who specialize in Occupational Medicine and are able to meet the medical needs of injured employees.

- Provide an initial prescription card if injured employees require a prescription; and
- Work with Employing Agencies to process related claims.
- Possible addendum for pre-employment physicals
